He lectures post-graduate courses of International Anticorruption Law, and Anti-Corruption Law in South Africa's Context and continues to supervise undergraduate, masters and doctoral students. He is also a member of the African Committee of Experts on the Rights and Welfare of the Child, Special Rapporteur on Children Affected by Armed Conflict and the Chairperson of the Working Group on the Implementation of Decisions. He also serves as a member of the Working Group on Children's Rights and Climate Change. He is also He has published and presented at various national and international conferences. Before joining academia, Robert was a prosecutor with the Directorate of Public Prosecutions, Uganda for nine years.
