#### **Abstract**

This working group workshop will introduce the model of child-centric data obtained via the CovidUnder19 global survey. Moreover, it will introduce the child court performance assessment and the resulting infographics which have been developed by the Group Development Pakistan and jointly implemented with the judiciary in Pakistan. These data collection, analysis, and usage processes will be presented, and inputs to improve those discussed. Upscaling, replication options to enhance Justice With Children, and an Asian basis of evidence on this topic will be discussed.

#### **Key take-aways of the session**

- An example of good practice to collect, analyse, and use child-centric data is shared with Asian partners.
- A MEAL tool for Justice With Children is improved by Asian partners.
- A plan for Asian research on Justice With Children is developed.
